
Eliminate confusion between COMPLETED and CLOSED in ProDOC Packages!



These two words can be confused as similar in meaning. A dictionary check defines:


- Completed having all the necessary parts or elements to finish
- Closed not open

To understand these statuses in ProDOC's Package Manager, the dictionary definitions are important to know as well as these more technical ones below:

- Completed: Required (automatic)
- Closed: Done (human interaction)

Summing up these two meanings and applying them to Package Manager statuses, we get:

- Completed: Once all REQUIRED documents have been gathered, signed and returned (although optional documents may not be), the system automatically changes the status to Completed.
- Closed: Once a Package has a Completed status, a user from your organization, by permission only, now must go into the Completed Package to determine if this package is done and ready to be closed. They then specify a reason at Close out.



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
